Host Chairman Geoff introduced the Guest speakers Shannon O'Neill and Kristina Sarris both from the City of Gosnells Community Development Team. They did a combined slide presentation outlining all of the community based programmes that they are involved with. The City of Gosnells is the fourth largest local Government within Western Australia. It has a population in excess of 88,000 people and there is 45% of the city that has the capacity to be developed. They work with a diverse range of people which includes a large multicultural component as there has been a huge growth with the ethnic and culturally diverse population. There are seventy different groups speaking a total of eighty different languages. The annual food fair is an excellent venue for promoting multiculturalism and is being promoted again on 16th November.

The Indigenous Partnership with the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders oversees projects such as the Noongar Food Garden, NAIDOC week, Cultural Film Screening and Oral history. Partnerships with Amaroo, Langford Aboriginal Association, Muslim Charity Community, Yule Brook College, Polynesian Community, Australian Asian Association and Dutch community help to develop sustainable projects.

President Andy offered a vote of thanks and then formally closed the meeting with Thornlie Rotary Club's rendition of Advance Australia Fair.
