**PP Colin advised** that the Risk Management committee had met and minutes of the meeting, containing recommendations on BNB traffic management, would be considered at the next Board meeting.

**Ian Archibald's Blog** – attached are a couple of photos showing one of the major reasons for coming down here. Our Highland Cattle have arrived. The one with the white calf was interested in checking the place out. The one with the 3 days old calf stepped off the truck and immediately commenced grazing. Neither of them has seen so much tucker.

Hopefully tomorrow I will secure the chook pen and then obtain some Wyandotte bantams because says they are pretty.

The cow with the 3 days old calf came from South Australia a where Liver Fluke is prevalent. She had to be in quarantine for 100 days. She had a liver fluke drench arriving at the quarantine station at Kalgoorlie then another 30 days later and then a feecal sample 70 days later which she passed. Evidently years ago in Britain there was a drench made from a male fern to combat liver fluke that was somewhat hit and miss with success. Todays treatment is so close to 100%.

Now I wrestle with live stock ownership. Yes I have to have brand/ear mark but I have to have a PIC (Property Identification Certification) a NVD Waybill book to compile for movement of stock. If this is not compiled the truck driver will not load the stock and should the animals arrive at the sale yards without one you pay for the return journey home. But before I can be issued with this I had to under go an oral test after reading the manual to ascertain that I understood the regulations. In addition I have to have a NLIS registration ( national livestock identification system) which is an electronic ear tag that can be read as stock pass through a cattle race in sale yard. The purpose of a NLIS registration is to trace stock from birth to slaughter in case of disease out break. If the animal has been born on your property a white NLIS tag is used. If the animal come from another property or has lost it tag it is issued with a an orange tag.

Now that I have passed the test I can process PIC and NLIS on my PC and or buy an electronic reader, plug it into my PC and down load the ratings to NLIS and the Meat and Live Stock Association (MLA ).

All this comes with minimal cost but now to the ear mark pliers. We need two, one for top of the ear and one for the bottom of the ear. \$350 each. Thanks very BM

Chairman Ross invited Sarah Jermaine to address the meeting. Sarah works with the Disability Services Commission (DSC) at head office and liaises closely with state and local government offices. Access is more than just ramps and 20% of WA's population has some form of disability. Disability covers a wide spectrum including amputations; hearing loss and intellectual disabilities. With the aging population disability services extend to aged homes; respite centres and local area coordinators have been appointed.

The Disability Discrimination Act is of great assistance and cases can proceed to the Human Rights and Opportunity Board. There is also the Equal Opportunity Act and Disability Services Act to assist disabled persons who experience problems.

There are physical assistance mechanisms – ramps; disabled toilets and disabled parking bays and lobbying is being undertaken to extend the number of disabled parking bays. In planning facilities consider making aisles wide enough; counters low enough and ensure no obstructions in way such as boxes. There are checklists available on the DSC website. Aspects currently being examined are wheelchair access to beaches and access to hotels/motels for tourism. Access aspects can benefit all, by doing it right the first time.

Sebastian Cain introduced himself as the local area coordinator and a point of contact for Rotarians.

Chairman Ross re-introduced Maureen Betts, Inner Wheel District A40 Past President, who proceeded to outline the role of Inner Wheel, including:-

- 14 clubs in WA
- 2<sup>nd</sup> largest women's group in the world
- Formed by Margaret Golding in Manchester UK in 1924
- First Australian clubs were at Ballarat; Bendigo and North Sydney
- In 1967 International Inner Wheel was formed with HQ in UK.
- International conventions every 3 years
- Have raised \$1 million for Cord Blood project
- Clubs now on 5 continents
- India the biggest growing membership.
- Four International Presidents from Australia
- Seven representatives sit on the United Nations
- Communicate Our Vision – theme for this year
- Clubs meet once a month
