The museum's collection is focussed on local history and the local community and relies on community donations; current activities and volunteers for his continuance. Currently there are 18 volunteers who assist with school visits and open days (Sunday 2pm to 5pm; Wednesday 10am to 2pm). The latest project is a "shed project" to allow for more space for volunteers to carry out restoration and repairs. Brochures on the museum were circulated.

President Andy thanked Mary Maxwell for her talk and closed the meeting.
