He was less than impressed with having to read the charge, much to Ron Bradborn's delight.</p> <p><b>Meeting closed at 19.45 to enable the committee meetings to take place</b></p> <p><b>Bill Douglas's Blog</b> - Thought I would send this just to let you know what we do here in Singapore.</p> <p>The picture below has been taken on the existing Chevron facilities in the Gulf of Thailand and our Project has had the artist impression of our Project superimposed on to the photo. Total cost will be approx US\$1.5BN</p> <p>The Platong Gas II (PGII) Project will add a 420mmscfd Central Processing Platform (CPP), 200-Person Living Quarters Platform (LQ), Flare Tower Platform and connecting bridges to the existing Platong Complex as well as significant Brownfield modifications to accept the new facilities. The Platong Gas Complex is centrally located within the Gulf of Thailand. For first gas, the project also includes 4 Wellhead Platforms, flowlines and approximately 100 wells. The project is around 2/3rds complete on detailed design and approximately 10% through fabrication. The LQ will be installed in the summer of 2010 and the CPP topsides in early 2011. The CPP integrated topsides will be installed by Floatover and at almost 20,000 metric tons is one of the largest Floatovers to date.</p>
