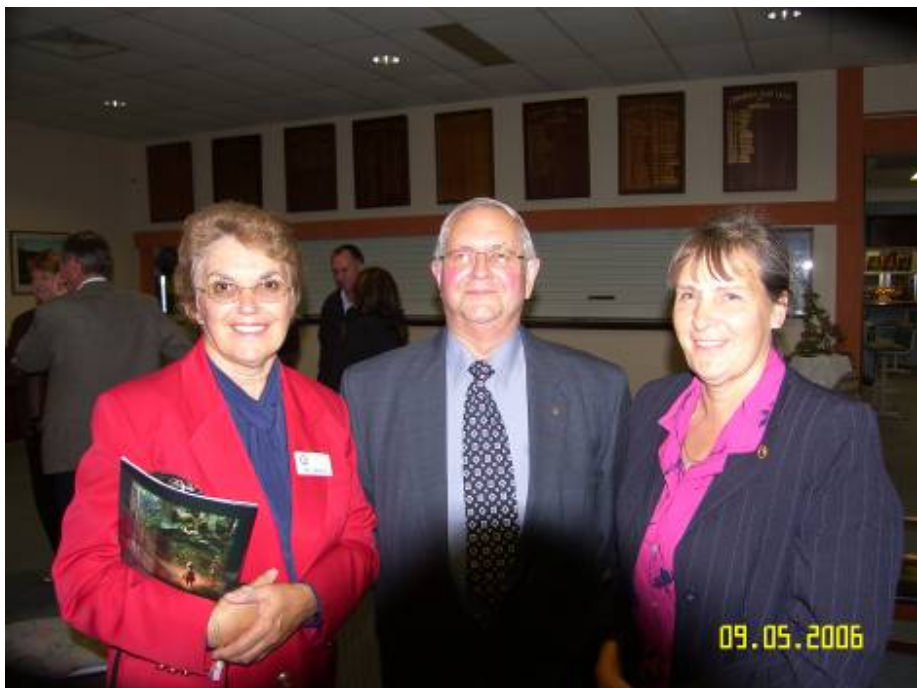

Guest speaker for the evening was Angela Babb, Manager at Centro Maddington Shopping Centre.

Angela was born in Busselton, Graduated from UWA with honours in Industrial relation, went into the marketing arena, ending up as site manager at Maddington.

The parent company, Centro have expanded the number of Properties that they own from 133 in 2004 to 224 today. In the same period their funds under management has grown for \$A6.4 billion to \$A9.1 billion.

Although the Maddington trade area has been identified as having a lower socio economic demographic, which reflects on disposable income, purchase decisions, attitude and behaviour, with a profile that exhibits high proportion of children, lower to middle income earning, one parent families and lower home ownership – the centre punches well above it weight in trading and this is with out having highway frontage.

The subsidiary purpose of inviting Angela to address the club, was the fact that we had, some 12 years ago, transferred Bring'N'Buy from the Thornlie Shopping Centre to Maddington.

This major relocation was done with minimum fuss and full cooperation with Maddington Shopping centre.


During that 12 years period the centre has assisted the club to raise \$1,000,000 for community and charitable projects. In addition both the Rotary Clubs of Maddington and Kenwick had also benefited from their involvement with the Centre – possibly to the tune of another half million.

In an expression of gratitude to the centre for their help and assistance, Angela was presented with a marble plaque to commemorate the milestone. Additionally a full page advertisement was placed in the "Comment News" so members of the districts community were aware of the milestone.

Action is now in hand to involve all staff and Employees working at Centro Maddington in a competition that will further mark the event and allow them to be involved with the club's ongoing activities.
