In this day and age it is surprising to find someone dedicated enough to produce a journal worthy of the read let alone fining him for simply doing his job. Most members were astonished at this fine and all voiced their disappointment.

**PDG Bill** introduced our guest speaker **Dale Edgar** who is a senior physiotherapist at RPH Burns unit. Dale is now pursuing a PHD in the treatment of burns and works with Prof Fiona Woods.

Dale's subject was Burns Survivor Treatment – Rehabilitation starts at the time of injury. The quality of the outcome must be worth the pain of survival. Only 3% of burn patients die and this is because of the Burns Units' skills in ICU.

Dale emphasized that if we took nothing else away from tonight we shouldn't underestimate the value of first aid for burns treatment at the start. 20 minutes of cool running water over a burn is the best first aid treatment. Remove clothing and jewelry and don't ever put ice on a burn. If there is no running water then use cool wet towels.

Dale ran through the major causes of burns, of which one third comes to RPH in summer.

Dale then gave us an insight into the surgery technology that is used with the help of some fairly graphic photographs. The Burns Team treatment includes Fluid resuscitation, Pain relief, Nutrition, Dressings (less than 40% need surgery), surgery (the deeper the burn, the more likely that surgery is required) and concomitant injuries (injuries caused at the same time of the burn)

Spray on skin is a small piece of skin that is sent to the lab, cultured and then grown. The result is harvested earlier and placed in a suspension and then sprayed on in conjunction with skin grafts. This is the process that has been pioneered by Fiona Wood.

How do burns patients get their lives back? Dale's main role is to try and slow down the swelling in a burn. The catchphrase is "**move it or lose it**". For every day that the patient doesn't move they lose 3% of their muscle power. Fit balls are extensively used – it's never too much trouble to get people up and walking because that is the thing that will get them through.

**Ron Bradock** gave the vote of thanks. Whilst **Sgt Ken** tried to quietly zip up his case ready for a quick getaway.
